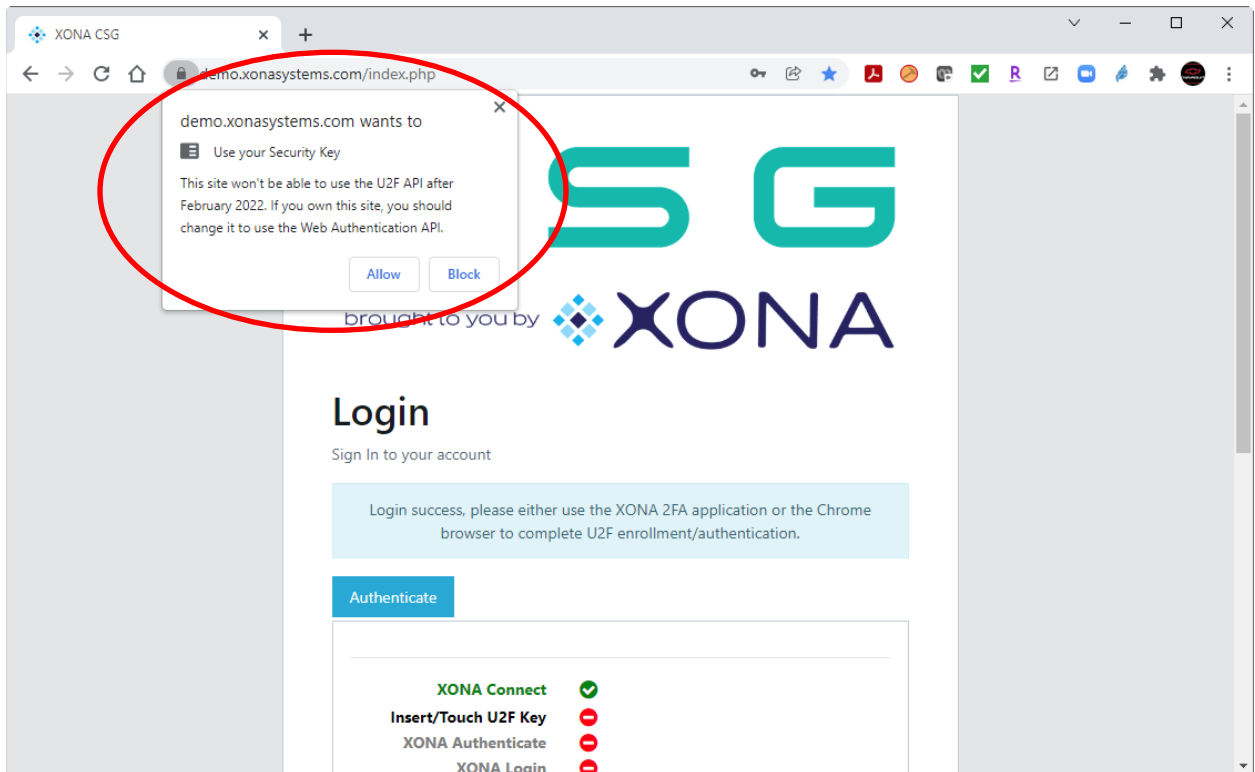


U2F Deprecation on Chromium based browsers December 2021

Google Chromium Engine has announced the End of Life for U2F multi-factor authentication support. This is being advertised today to users every time they sign in to authenticate on multi-factor authentication gateways, such as the XONA CSG. Google expects to end all support for this protocol in early February 2022.

Current CSG administrators should create a migration plan now to update current U2F users to implement WebAuthn as the multi-factor protocol. This may require upgrading the hard token authentication keys. Administrators need to verify which key current users have today.

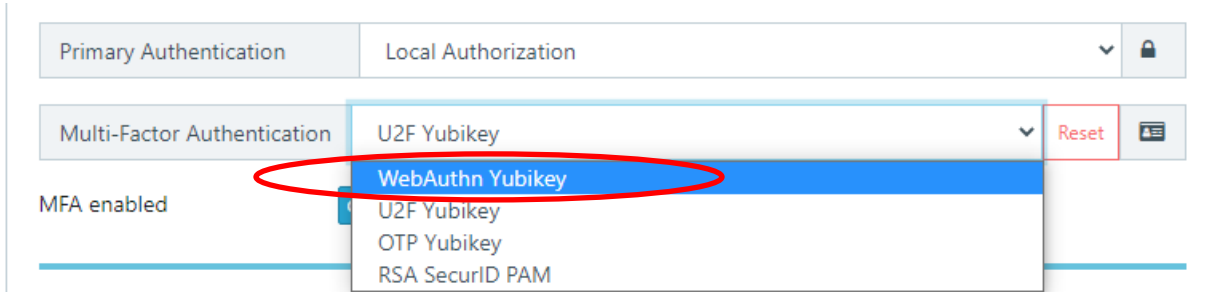

XONA Systems recommends that system administrators take action today. Administrators should reconfigure user profiles to use WebAuthn as the MFA protocol.



In the case where the user doesn't have a hardware token that supports WebAuthn, the user should use a different browser (ie: FireFox) until they can obtain a new token. XONA Systems offers new Yubikey tokens that support WebAuthn for sale.
